Principal's Page

In October, Wisconsin released student testing scores for all school districts from the new Wisconsin Forward Exam that was first implemented this past spring. The WI Forward is the third different test used by the state in the past three years to assess students. In a small district like ours, the scores are susceptible to varying percentile changes with each student worth a higher percentage than they would be in a bigger school. I thought it important to share our current scores, so you are aware of the many positives occurring at Gilmanton Schools. Students were assessed in four areas: English Language Arts (ELA), Math, Science, and Social Studies. All students in grades 3-8 were tested in the areas of ELA & Math; grades 4 & 8 were tested in Science; and grades 4, 8, & 10 were tested in Social Studies. Based on results, students are categorized in four areas: Advanced, Proficient, Basic, & Below Basic. While we are always striving for improvement in our teaching methods, it is also positive to see our students testing well above the state average. (Continued on next page)
